ELECTION DAY, JUNE 12, POLLS OPEN 7 AM TO 7 PM

No candidate received a majority of the votes cast in the May 8 election for City Council District 1, so the two top candidates, Victor Hernandez and GlenRobertson, will be in a Runoff Election on June 12, 2010. Candidates are listed alphabetically with replies to a questionnaire sent before the May 8 Election printed without editing or verification. Replies exceeding the word limit are indicated by slashes (///).

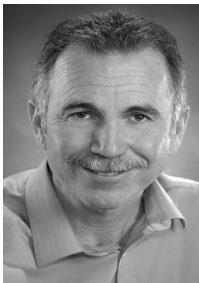

Voting in this Election

To vote in the Runoff Election you must be registered to vote in District 1. If you are registered in District 1, you may vote in the Runoff Election even if you did not vote in the original election on May 8. You can verify that you are registered to vote from the Secretary of State's website: www.sos.state.tx.us (Am I Registered?). If you have questions, call the **Lubbock County Office of Elections (775-1868)**.

Bring identification when you go to vote. Your voter registration certificate is best because the bar code will reduce the time it takes to verify your registration. If you are registered but have lost or misplaced your voter registration certificate, you may vote by providing some form of identification (e.g., drivers license, DPS personal identification card, utility bill, bank statement, government document with name and address, etc.) and signing an affidavit at the polls.

Early Voting June 1 to June 8

During early voting you may vote any polling location. Bring identification with you when you go to vote. Your voter registration certificate is best. If you are registered but have misplaced your voter registration certificate, you will be allowed to vote with other identification.

Lubbock County Elections Office, Public Room, 1308 Crickets: June 1-8, 8 am-8 pm, except Sunday, June 6, 1-6 pm.

United Supermarkets (Amigos, 112 N. University Ave.; 50th & Q): June 1-8, 8 am-8 pm, except Sunday, June 6, 1-6 pm.

City of Lubbock, First Floor: June 1 & June 8, 8 am-8 pm; June 2-5 and June 7, 8 am-5 pm (Closed Saturday & Sunday)

Election Day, June 12, Polls Open 7 am to 7 pm

On Election Day you must vote at the polling location for the precinct in which you are registered to vote. Your precinct is indicated on your voter registration certificate. You may call the Lubbock County Office of Elections, 775-1868, to determine your precinct or with other questions. Bring identification with you when you go to vote. Your voter registration certificate is best. If you are registered but have misplaced your voter registration certificate, you will be allowed to vote with other identification
